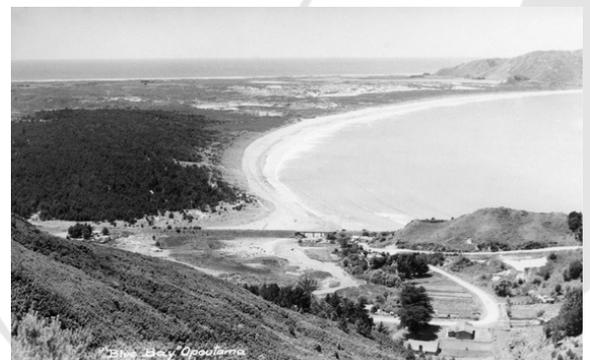
AGED CARE WĀNANGA

Our kaimahi have been hard at work clearing wilding pine from the whenua to protect dunes, restore native plants, and safeguard our wai. This mahi is about kaitiakitanga - looking after the land now for generations to come.

Surf and water safety sessions have been a hit, supporting the full Whare Tapa Whā. This day was focused on taking our tamariki out for a paddle, building confidence on the water, strengthening connection to the moana, and learning water safety through hands-on experience. Great mahi tamariki!
