Recently, our kura tamariki spent a day at Te Rahui o Karaiti (Formerly YMCA), exploring the area and asking pātai about its history. They also rolled up their sleeves and helped repot a large number of native plants, including karaka, harakeke, kākābeak, kōwhai, akeake, and karo. To thank them for all their hard mahi, we rewarded the tamariki with a refreshing swim at Morere - a well-deserved way to end the day. It was a fantastic opportunity for our tamariki to connect with te taiao, learn about our local environment, and take part in hands-on mahi that nurtures both our plants and our people. We also got creative, making Christmas trees out of decorated pinecones, as well as a larger Christmas tree using wire and driftwood.

Despite the weather, our weekly touch sessions have been going extremely well. Whānau are warmly invited to join us every Wednesday at 4:30 PM at Māhia Beach Landing for a fun and social game of touch rugby. All ages and skill levels are welcome, simply turn up ready to play, have a laugh, and enjoy connecting with our community. It's a great opportunity to stay active, spend time with whānau, and engage in positive kōrero with our people.











Our native nursery continues to thrive, and it has been uplifting to see the strong growth and resilience of the plants we have been nurturing. Recent updates shared on our Facebook page highlight the progress across our planting sites, as well as the ongoing mahi within the nursery.

We warmly encourage whānau who wish to return native species to their whenua or contribute to this kaupapa to get in touch. Our collective aspiration is to restore, regenerate, and reconnect our people with their whenua.

Our E Kai Māori Wānanga was a great success, deeply enriched by the energy and aroha of the participating whānau. This event marked a significant step in reclaiming and sharing our traditional Kai Māori knowledge. The three-day wānanga covered everything from foraging and rongoa identification to whakawhanaungatanga and weaving. Practical sessions included food preparation, linking rongoā to the kai through whakapapa and tikanga, hāngi preparation, and culminated in the cooking and presentation of the food, establishing a strong, holistic connection from the ngahere to the whenua and finally to the table.
